1. Confirmation of Quorum, Welcome & President's Remarks

Dr. Snow welcomed everyone to the meeting

2. Approval of Minutes of the December 13, 2024 Board Meeting

The motion to approve the Minutes of the December 13, 2024 Board meeting was moved by Maria Amaral and seconded by Scott Lanaway. All were in favour and no one opposed. **Motion Approved.**

3. Business Arising

There was no business arising.



- 4. Consent Agenda: Executive Director's Report (Shem Singh)
- Lung Cancer Canada is in the process of expanding the Airways of Hope program to Quebec.
- The Halifax Summit is coming up. A lot of excitement. It will be in-person and virtual. Summits in Montreal and St. Johns are also planned.
- Mr. Singh invited Dr. Snow to talk about the Lung Cancer Canada Policy series that will continue in October 2025.
 Dr. Snow has been working with Peter Glazier of Lung Cancer Canada. Dates for the policy webinars are being finalized; topics are timely and include biomarker testing, the drug approval process and diagnostic delay.
- Lung Cancer Canada is launching a bilingual awareness campaign in conjunction with the Mike Bossy Memorial Fund. Mr. Singh invited Mr. Lanaway to speak about the process. Mr. Lanaway and his company have canvassed Tanya Bossy, Lung Cancer Canada and a patient group to develop a lung cancer awareness campaign. A second campaign has also been identified for future use.
- Congratulations to the inaugural Give a Breath Research Award winners. Public announcement of recipients to follow.
- On the operational side, Lung Cancer Canada welcomed two new team members; they are welcome additions.
- On the IT project front, Lung Cancer Canada is between phase 2 and 3 of implementation of the matters addressed in the IT Audit. New IT equipment has now been purchased, configured and delivered. (Emi Bossio joined the meeting).
- 5. Finance Report (Shem Singh)

Mr. Singh provided a brief overview of the finances. Ms. Amaral reported back on the positive meeting with the accountant. Very promising launch of the Give a Breath campaign, including new potential sponsorship.



6. 2025 Budget (Shem Singh)

Mr. Singh provided a brief overview of the budget which was previously reviewed in more detail at the December 2024 Board meeting. There were no changes since the previous review. 2025 Faces of Lung Cancer Report Stories that Unite Us. Change that Moves Us.

- The 2025 theme builds on the spirit of community and equity established in 2024 — moving from awareness and access to impact and transformation
- It highlights the unique power of stories from patients, caregivers, and healthcare professionals not just to inform, but to drive real, systemic change in lung cancer care
- Each section will explore a system-level challenge through three interwoven lenses: Lived Experience; Clinical and Research Insights; and Action & Advocacy.
- Interviewees, including physicians and patients, have been identified and interviews are scheduled to take place from mid-June through July



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HTA Submissions and Medical Advisory Committee

Currently there are 2 active input submissions at CDA:

SC/IV atezolizumab as monotherapy for 1st line NSCLC -Due Aug 5. Clinical lead is being identified within the MAC, patient input is being led by Winky at LCC
Funding Algorithm for Small Cell Lung Cancer - Due July 5. Winky has also agreed to write patient input on behalf of the LHF+CCSN partnership.

There is also a new submission in the pipeline around July/August. Winky has been briefed by Bayer on this file, and the core MAC has been notified to identify a lead. **SOHO-01 – sevabertinib** for treatment naïve HER2 advanced NSCLC

- LCC has engaged and participated in the recent CDA webinars regarding biomarker testing, evolving patient and clinician inputs. Feedback has been submitted to CDA for evolving the patient input, and clinician webinar is being led by Dr. Juergens
- LCC confirmed to lead patient submission to CDA re: Rapid Provisional Funding - Small Cell Lung Cancer, due July 11
- Clinical inputs continue to be solely led by LCC's Medical Advisory Committee; LCC, Lung Health Foundation (LHF), and Canadian Cancer Survivors Network (CCSN) continuing to partner on upcoming patient inputs

Industry Funding Sponsorships

- As of June 10 (for the activities Core Programs, Public Affairs Strategy, and/or Evening of Hope):
 - Confirmed sponsorships: 11 companies, total \$475,825
 - Awaiting decision: 2 companies (Bayer, Takeda)
 - Declined/No response: 6 companies

Chronic Cough Pathway

- Founding member of the newly formed Pathways Working Group, part of the All.Can Canada initiative, focused on codeveloping symptom-based cancer investigation tools to support earlier diagnosis in primary care
- The group is initially prioritizing the development of a chronic cough pathway, emphasizing GP interventions for both smoking and non-smoking populations
- This work will help address diagnostic delays and directly inform broader awareness efforts, including Lung Cancer Canada's national campaign

Research

Geoffrey Ogram Memorial Research Grant

- The 2025 application cycle opened on May 20, accepting applications via the LCC website, with a deadline of September 30, and adjudication meeting with the Research Committee is scheduled for October
- Dawn Ogram has confirmed to continue to offer up to two awards of \$25,000 each this year

Lung Ambition Awards

- Contracts for the 2024-2025 winners have been finalized, and funding has been sent
- Award announcement presentation was held in-person at the ELIXR Conference in Montreal, with Brian Seguin from AstraZeneca Canada and Dr. Stephanie Snow representing LCC. Dr. Snow introduced the awards and the 2025 winners' projects, while AZ spoke on the importance of research investments and partnerships with LCC
- A very positive meeting was held between AZ, LAA, and LCC on June 13 regarding the potential renewal of the awards program. LCC has provided a draft agreement for review

Pfizer – LCC - Lung Health Foundation – Quebec Lung **Association Grant**

- The call for applications is now closed
- The 2025 awards was the third and final year. Discussions will need to be initiated about the future of the program

Give A Breath 5K Research Program

- Contracts for the inaugural winners have been finalized, and funding awards have been sent
- Dr. Cheryl Ho confirmed to attend and make remarks on her research project at the GAB Vancouver event
- The next application cycle set to open on June 7 in conjunction with the GAB event day, with a deadline in September. Adjudication meeting to be held in Oct with the Research Committee





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Research

LCC Research Foundation

I am pleased to share that Lung Cancer Canada is developing a new internal initiative - the LCC Research Foundation. This Foundation will focus on funding external, evidence-based research that supports early detection, treatment access, and health equity for people affected by lung cancer.

We're in the early planning stages of the LCC Research Foundation, with a formal launch targeted for January 1, 2026.

Procedurally, we're looking forward to moving this forward in earnest following the AGM and completion of the audit. At that point, we'll begin working more closely with Emi, Paul, and Maria to help guide the next phase of development, including structure, governance, and early strategic planning.

I am looking forward to continuing the conversation with all of you to gather initial feedback and continue shaping this timely and consequential initiative.





Succession Planning: Ensuring Leadership Continuity & Long-Term Impact

Lung Cancer Canada is committed to proactive and adaptive succession planning to ensure organizational stability, leadership continuity, and long-term mission success.

Strategic Oversight & Quarterly Review

Succession planning will be formally reviewed each quarter through the Nominating and Governance Committee, with regular updates provided to the Board to remain responsive to:

- Evolving organizational needs
- Leadership development opportunities
- Planned or unexpected transitions (e.g., retirements, resignations)

Core Pillars of Our Approach

- Two-Tiered Planning
 - Emergency Succession Contingency plans for unplanned departures
 - Planned Transitions Structured, timely processes for leadership renewal
- Succession matrix & leadership pipeline to help assess leadership strength, identify gaps, and develop future leaders across the Board
- Ongoing mentorship and committee involvement to prepare future-ready leaders





Operations

• IT Audit

- LCC's existing vendor, IT Pilots, has completed the workstation set up and delivered laptops to employees. A secure cloud system and infrastructure have been established, with regular security updates maintained by IT Pilots
- LCC is currently developing organizational policies (extending beyond IT), which will be submitted for Board approval and subsequently signed off by employees
- As of July 1st, 2025, LCC and IT Pilots have entered into a services agreement.

RBC PayEdge Payment System

- LCC plans to move forward with implementing RBC PayEdge within the next month to modernize and streamline our AP process
- RBC PayEdge offers a secure and flexible way to manage vendor payments, supporting multiple payment methods, role-based access, two-factor authentication, and detailed audit tracking
- This transition is a low-risk, cost effective solution that will reduce processing time, improve oversight, eliminate manual cheque handling, and enhance overall financial control and operational efficiency



Office Lease Extension

- LCC has received a formal proposal from the landlord for a 5-year lease extension at our current location. The proposed term would run from November 1, 2025, to October 31, 2030
- After reviewing the terms and comparing them to current market rates for similar office spaces, we are in a favourable position. We have also negotiated one-month free base rent in the third year
- Our recommendation is to move forward with accepting the proposal as it supports both operational continuity and long-term planning without the disruption or added cost of relocating
