We'll also be releasing our **2025 Faces of Lung Cancer Report**, a powerful snapshot of the lived experience of lung cancer in Canada today. Grounded in real stories and national data, this year's report moves from awareness and access to impact and transformation. By elevating patient, caregiver, and clinician voices, it highlights urgent care gaps and drives action toward more equitable access to screening, diagnosis, treatment, and support — for everyone, everywhere.

She continues:

"I've seen firsthand the barriers patients face: in screening, testing, treatment, and trials. And I've seen what's possible when we break those barriers down. We save lives. We restore hope. That's the work ahead, and I'm honoured to lead it with this remarkable community."

As the only national charity in Canada exclusively dedicated to lung cancer, Lung Cancer Canada's mission continues across four core pillars: advocacy, patient support, public awareness, and research. Under Dr. Juergens' leadership, advocacy will take on an even more focused and strategic role — informed by the lived experiences of patients and guided by five national advocacy priorities:

- 1. Increasing survivorship through equitable access to screening
- 2. Breaking down barriers to timely and comprehensive biomarker testing
- 3. Ensuring every patient can access the most effective treatments
- 4. Boosting public and private investment in lung cancer research
- 5. Expanding access to clinical trials across all regions and populations

"Dr. Juergens brings a fire and urgency to this work — and a deep understanding that meaningful change happens when advocacy, support, science, and community come together," says Shem Singh, Executive Director of Lung Cancer Canada. "She's a connector, a changemaker, and a leader with both the expertise and the heart to guide us into an ambitious new chapter."

"Rosalyn isn't just a colleague — she's a friend and a trusted partner in this work," adds Dr. Snow. "Her passion for lung cancer advocacy is boundless. With her at the helm, the future is in exceptional hands."

As we thank Dr. Snow for her extraordinary leadership, we welcome Dr. Juergens with open arms and high hopes. Together, we look ahead — to a future where no one faces lung cancer alone, and where every voice is heard, every life is valued, and every possibility is pursued.

Advancing Lung Cancer Research: Innovation, Equity, and Impact

At Lung Cancer Canada, research is very much at the heart of what we do, because research saves lives.

From better diagnostics to more personalized therapies, research has transformed the landscape of lung cancer care. But there's still more to do. Lung cancer remains the leading cause of cancer death in Canada and is one of the most underfunded and overlooked. That's why we continue to invest in bold, patient-centered research that drives equity, improves outcomes, and sparks meaningful change.

We are proud to have already awarded over \$150,000 in 2025 to Canadian research teams advancing discovery across the care continuum — from diagnostics and treatment to access and patient navigation. And we're just getting started.

Inaugural Give a Breath Research Award Recipients

Funded through the Give a Breath 5K, this new award supports innovative projects for patients living with advanced or metastatic lung cancer, specifically after first-line therapy.

- Dr. Cheryl Ho (BC Cancer): Leading research on a novel lab test that could personalize immunotherapy for patients with oncogene-driven non-small cell lung cancer. By analyzing tumour blood vessels and immune markers together, the study aims to uncover new strategies for more effective, targeted treatment with fewer side effects.
- Dr. Donna Murrell (London Health Sciences Centre): Conducting a clinical study to assess the safety of repeat radiation in patients with oligoprogression (progression in areas away from the main tumour), while they are on other treatments. The goal: to help patients stay on their preferred systemic therapy longer, while treating metastatic disease, and maintaining quality of life.

2025 Lung Ambition Award Recipients

In partnership with AstraZeneca and the Lung Ambition Alliance, Lung Cancer Canada is proud to co-lead this national research awards program focused on improving the patient pathway.

Dr. Emilian Olteanu (BC Cancer): Investigating the use of bronchoalveolar

- lavage (BAL) fluid to detect tumour DNA in early-stage lung cancer. This less-invasive method could improve diagnosis, especially for tumours located in hard-to-reach areas of the lung.
- Dr. Antoine Desilets (CHUM, Montreal): Advancing a next-generation liquid biopsy using whole-genome sequencing to identify tumour DNA through blood samples — with the potential to enable faster, earlier diagnosis and more personalized treatment for patients with early-stage lung cancer.

Two Research Awards Are Now Accepting Applications!

Geoffrey Ogram Memorial Research Grant

Founded in honour of lung cancer advocate and former Lung Cancer Canada Board member Geoffrey Ogram, this award funds high-impact projects focused on early detection, prevention, and disparities across populations.

Grant Value: Up to two grants of \$25,000 each

A second round of funding is now available to support new projects focused on treatment innovations beyond first-line therapy for advanced or metastatic lung cancer patients.

2025 Policy Series: It's Time to Get Serious About Lung Cancer

In 2024, Lung Cancer Canada launched its Lung Cancer Policy Series to turn advocacy into action — creating a national platform where policy, clinical, and patient voices come together to tackle the most urgent challenges in lung cancer care. Now in its second year, the 2025 edition builds on that momentum with a sharp focus on one critical issue: timely and equitable access to precision medicine.

This year's series, moderated by Dr. Stephanie Snow, Medical Oncologist and Past President of Lung Cancer Canada, will explore the growing gap between scientific possibility and patient reality. Dr. Snow brings both clinical expertise and a strong voice for patient-centred care to the conversation — guiding a series of national dialogues that aim to dismantle the delays that too often stand between lung cancer patients and life-saving innovation.

Bridging the Gap: Precision Medicine in Lung Cancer Diagnosis and Treatment

Moderated by Dr. Stephanie Snow

Dates: October 7, October 28, and November 18

Despite rapid advancements in biomarker testing and targeted therapies, the promise of precision medicine is still out of reach for too many patients. Long waits for diagnosis, inconsistent access to biomarker testing, and fragmented treatment pathways continue to stand in the way of better outcomes.

This three-part series will bring together thought leaders from across Canada — clinicians, researchers, policymakers, administrators, industry leaders, and patient advocates — to address these challenges head-on. Together, we'll explore bold, practical strategies to improve time to patient and ensure more Canadians benefit from the right test and the right treatment at the right time.

Session 1: Diagnostic Delays and Biomarker Testing

Tuesday, October 7 | 2:00-3:30 PM EST

The opening session will explore how delayed diagnosis and inconsistent biomarker testing are undermining access to personalized care. We'll examine best practices for test implementation,

the impact of provincial infrastructure gaps, and what it will take for governments to standardize precision medicine delivery across the country.

Session 2: Treatment Access and Drug Approval Processes Tuesday, October 28 | 2:00–3:30 PM EST

Session 2 will turn to the next link in the chain: how we get patients the treatments they're tested for. We'll look at the shortcomings in drug approval and funding timelines, the role value-based healthcare can play in improving access, and the policy shifts needed to bring innovation to patients faster.

Session 3: Collaborative Strategies for Reducing Delays Tuesday, November 18 | 2:00–3:30 PM EST

We'll close the series by bringing it all together — focusing on how federal and provincial governments, healthcare providers, researchers, industry leaders, and patient advocates can align around shared goals. We'll spotlight successful cross-sector partnerships, explore new models for integration, and surface actionable policy recommendations.

Lung cancer patients don't have time to wait. Precision medicine has transformed what's possible in lung cancer — but that promise is lost without a system that delivers the right tests and treatments at the right time. The 2025 Lung Cancer Policy Series is Lung Cancer Canada's call to action. It's an opportunity to advance real solutions, grounded in evidence, experience, and equity.
